10.45 am for 11.00 - 11.50 North Transept	<p>Lecture by Dr Jonathan Foyle 'English Cathedrals as Medieval Flower Gardens' Dr Jonathan Foyle is former Chief Executive of World Monuments Fund Britain, and Curator of Historic Buildings at Historic Royal Palaces. Following architectural training at Canterbury and a Courtauld Institute MA on Tudor and Stuart-era Art & Architecture, his PhD presented a reconstruction of Cardinal Wolsey's Hampton Court. He is now a consultant on the analysis, interpretation and presentation of historic buildings and associated artifacts, about which he lectures widely. A presenter of numerous television programmes on architecture and history (such as BBC2's 'Climbing Great Buildings' and more recently Channel 4's 'Restoration of the Year'), he is a regular contributor to the FT Weekend on issues of heritage and crafts - his Artisans' series represents over 100,000 words - and he has just begun writing his fifth monograph of an English cathedral.</p>

2.00 - 3.00 pm Salisbury Museum	<p>'Henry Lamb: Out of the Shadows' Free-flow Tour with special introduction max 20 people, starting at 2.00 pm Henry Lamb was one of the leading British figurative painters of the first part of the 20th century. He was also an accomplished musician, trained as a doctor and his friends described him as a well-read and erudite conversationalist. A close friend of Augustus John, patron of Stanley Spencer and friends with members of the Bloomsbury Group, he was a founder member of the Camden Town Group in 1911. Portraiture played an important role in his career as a painter, but his townscapes and landscapes as well as his early subject pictures of Ireland and Brittany and his work in both World Wars reveal him to be a painter of considerable range and talent. This exhibition is the first major retrospective of Henry Lamb's work since 1984. Time then for him to emerge from the shadows...</p>
